The University of Lincoln has a wide range of habitats and landscapes as a part of its estate – from agricultural land to historic parkland to urban habitats. The variety of habitats creates means that the ecology of the estate needs to be managed carefully.

The Environmental Policy of the University includes a commitment to monitor and protect biodiversity.

In order to meet this commitment the University will:

- Meet the requirements of all relevant biodiversity legislation
- Procure ecological surveys to gain an understanding of its biodiversity assets
- Undertake projects that protect and enhance biodiversity around the University Estate
- Promote awareness of the ecological assets of the University assets among staff and students
- Support staff in using the biodiversity assets of the University as a learning resource
- Work with local and regional groups to support key species in areas where the University operates
- Make the Policy publicly available
- Review this Policy on an annual basis
